## JRP 2018 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES



- Provide timely lifesaving assistance and protection, as well as improve the living conditions of the Rohingya refugees and affected host communities.



- Ensure well-being and dignity of Rohingya refugees and the affected host communities.



- Support environmentally sustainable solutions.



- Building confidence and resilience of Rohingya refugees and the affected host communities.

The 2018 JRP demonstrates commitment from the humanitarian sectors to include 25% of their planned and funded activities for the affected host communities living in the proximity of the refugee camps and directly affected by the influx. 101 projects currently planned for Host under sectors.

## SUPPORT TO GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS

Support is being provided to government institutions to mitigate the impact on service delivery and strengthen systems in health and nutrition, water and sanitation, education, agriculture, forestry and environment. Collaboration with the Civil Surgeon, Public Health Engineering, Forestry and Environment, Social Services, Women and Children's Welfare is ongoing. Support is also being provided to the RRRC (and CIC's), Deputy Commissioner Office and UNOs in Ukhia and Teknaf in the management of the crisis.

## STRATEGY OF SUPPORT TO HOST COMMUNITIES

The approach under the humanitarian response is inclusive and extends critical programs of support to the most vulnerable among the affected host communities, many of who are facing similar problems as new arrivals. Under the Joint Response Plan (JRP) 2018, host communities will be supported at district, community and household levels. Priority areas of support are:

1. Environment and eco-system rehabilitation.
2. Agriculture, markets and livelihoods support.
3. Community and public infrastructure.
4. Health, nutrition and education.
