Background	<p>Platform in Disaster Displacement (PDD, <a href="http://www.disasterdisplacement.org">www.disasterdisplacement.org</a>) is a state-led process working towards better protection for people displaced across borders in the context of disasters and climate change. There are 19 states are the members of PDD including EU. PDD was chaired by Germany until December 2017, now it is chaired by Bangladesh. Its coordination unit is being hosted by UN Office of Project Services based in Geneva. IT has a advisory committee where COAST is a member.</p> <p>Meantime PDD played an influencing role in UNFCCC climate conferences and GFMD (Global Forum on Migration and Development) and also in preparation of Global Compact on Migration (GCM) and Global Compact on Refugees (GCR) , especially to include the issues of disaster displaced / climate displaced. Even they have succeeded to bring the issues in UN Security Council too.</p> <p>It's a matter of proud that in next 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> February 2019 Government of Bangladesh is going to host its conference in Dhaka, primarily to analyze sudden and slow on set disaster and its impact on human mobility and how there could be better protection of displaced people, and to discuss and exchange best practices through a Dhaka declaration.</p> <p>Taking this opportunity COAST does like to organize a dialogue with Bangladeshi civil</p>

	society primarily to share the concern and key asks for future. A cocktail reception will be there just after the dialogue.
