





































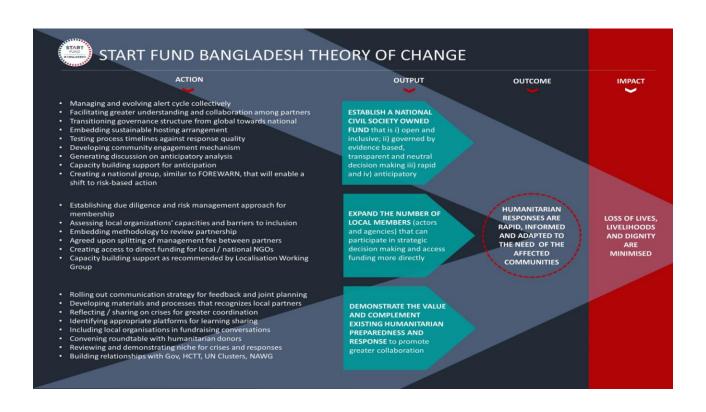




### What is Start Fund Bangladesh?

- The Start Network aims to change the humanitarian system shifting control to front-line responders, and improving finance and decision making
- The Start Network, a network of 42 leading humanitarian NGOs, created the Start Fund to fill the gap of early funding in humanitarian aid
- A rapid response funding mechanism that is owned and operated by the Start Network members
- **focusing on:** underfunded small- to medium-scale crises; forecasts of impending crises; and spikes in chronic humanitarian crises.
- Start Fund Bangladesh will be delivered over 4 years (2017-2020) with support from DFID Bangladesh with a budget of £10m and the participation of senior staff from <u>at least</u> 20 Start Network international members, national/local members and partner organisations upon **Start principles**.

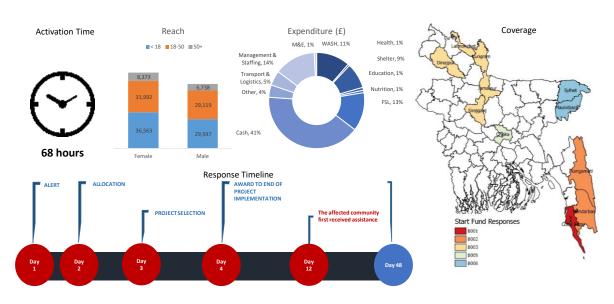


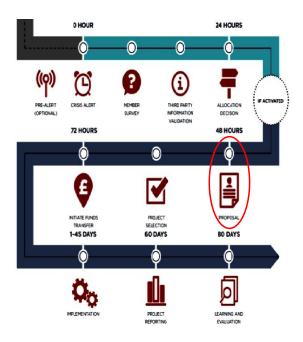

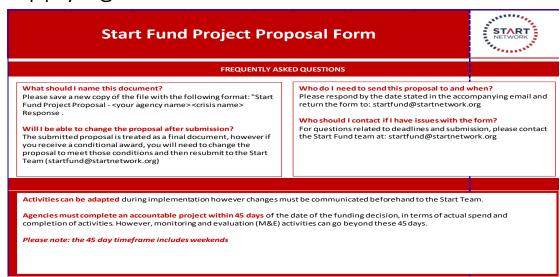
## Start Fund Bangladesh Alert Summary





- CRISIS ALERT: Any member agency can raise an alert for a crisis by submitting an alert note
- MEMBER SURVEY: Member agencies fill in a survey to provide additional info and state whether they support or oppose a Start Fund response
- ALLOCATION DECISION: An allocation decision is made on whether to activate the Fund and the amount
- PROPOSAL: Agencies are invited to submit project proposals within 24 hours
- PROJECT SELECTION: Project proposals are chosen using peer-review by Project Selection Committee
- FUNDS TRANSFER: Successful agencies are immediately notified and receive funds
- IMPLEMENTATION: Projects begin implementation within 7 days.
- REPORTING: Agencies report.
- LEARNING: All projects are peer-reviewed to identify actionable learning.

#### Part 01. Narrative

- Context, impact and funding landscape
- Activity rationale, approach (e.g. cash/NFI), coordination, procurement
- Partnership and method of implementation
- Target Area, beneficiary targeting, reach calculation
- Community engagement and feedback/complain mechanism
- Sectors (WaSH, FSL, shelter/NFI, health, nutrition, education, cash etc.)
- Expected results, risks
- M&E approach (age, sex, disability, location disaggregated data collection)
- Communication with communities and materials

#### Key Sections of Start Fund Proposal

#### Part 02. Activities

- Activity and activity type (selection, distribution, PDM etc.)
- Expected output and effect on the affected population
- Age, sex, disability disaggregated reach
- Total and adjusted reach

#### **Common Errors**

- Locations not specified
- Context and activities not aligned (e.g. context: loss of livelihood, activity: hygiene kit distribution)
- Sectors mismatch in narrative, budget, activity section (e.g. multipurpose / unconditional vs. FSL cash)

- Adjusted Reach refers to the reach without duplication (cash vs PDM beneficiaries)

- Check and double check formulas, they can be tricky!!!

### Things to remember

- Proposals are (almost universally) evaluated based on these criteria

Criteria	Explanation							
<u>Relevance</u>	The project saves lives, protects livelihoods and/or is filling gaps							
Relevance questions how much the project is in-	The intervention is based on an assessment and identifies and meets priority needs of the affected communities							
line with local needs and priorities, including	he intervention describes how it will meet the needs of the most vulnerable of those affected by the crisis							
policy.	The intervention is technically sound, accountable to beneficiaries and is based on relevant standards (e.g. SPHERE, CHS, etc) and/or locally agreed cluster guidelines							
<u>Efficiency</u>	The proposal evidences reasonable value for money, considering speed, cost and quality of the items and activities proposed							
	Procurement of relief items is appropriate to the context							
<u>Effectiveness</u>	The project approach is sound, involves beneficiaries throughout its lifecycle and is likely to be successful							
A measure of the extent to which an aid activity	The project (including resource mobilisation) will be ready to <u>commence</u> within 7-days and complete its intended purpose in 45 days							
can be expected to attain its purpose.	The proposal demonstrates contextually appropriate integration and coordination in the humanitarian relief effort(e.g. cluster, NDMA etc)							
	The member and/or its partner has the <u>capacity</u> to implement the project and has a <u>presence</u> in the affected area							
	[Context-specific criteria for consideration to be agreed at the start of project selection decision-making meeting ]							
Additional Criteria	The project is in line with any guidance provided by the Allocation Committee							
	The project is consistent with the <u>vision</u> of the Start Network							

## Why Proposals Don't Get Awarded?

- If proposal not submitted in deadline
- Using wrong (old) format instead of updated format
- Using format but customized e.g. added new row/columns, not follow format
- High management cost
- · Geographical duplication
- If proposed area not affected
- · Not following the standard package
- If major activities (including FD6/7) within 7 days not defined properly
- If organizational "True presence" not defined properly in the proposal
- · Not following all the guidelines or email communication
