COAST Origin and accreditation


- ✓ AAB start Bhola Project during 1984-97




Transformation Faced the following Changes with achievement


COAST Governance

- ✓ Published annual report and distributed to all stakeholders in every year







- Natural Disaster Preparedness





- ✓ Health Assistants for joint collaborative support with COAST C4D session on ANC/PNC
- ✓ Checkup of pregnant, Pneumonia, Iron tablet, Nutrition etc.
- ✓ -Need Orientation for Sanitation, Hand wash, Tibitop by LGED field staffs
- ✓ UP member support for getting allowance of ANC check up by GoB.

- Cooperation with UP to access of disable fund for list of disabilities.

Expected results

- By the end of 2016, 24,000 adolescent girls and boys in project areas have increased capacity to address their rights and healthy development and act as agents of social change.
- By the end of 2016, 396 Community Based Child Protection Committees (CBCPCs)/ Ward Development Committees (WDC) increased their capacity to address child rights violations such as children abuse, exploitation and child marriage.
- By the end of 2016, parents and care-givers have increased parenting skills and are engaged in community action to engage on child marriage and other adolescent issues.
- By the end of 2016, COAST's capacity to effectively deliver, respond and manage programmers supporting child protection system strengthened.

Major Activities

- Formation and functioning of 800 adolescent clubs.
- Formation of 44 advance adolescent groups and organize quarterly meetings.
- Conducting TOT on Life Skills Based Education (LSBE)
- Delivering 3 day training on LSBE for 800 adolescent
- Distribution of 450 adolescent stipends
- Capacity development and awareness building on personal and menstrual hygiene management of adolescent girls.
- TOT on Health and Nutrition and Impact of Child Marriage.

Major Activities-Contd...

- Deliver training on Child Development Module for 1,320 CBCPC/WDC members.
- Quarterly parents meetings
- Assisting schools in assessing students who are at risk of getting married
- Establishment of Sani Mart sales centre and Show room
- WASH facilities renovation of 20 secondary schools/madrasas including CFS Primary schools (toilets, water points).

UNICEF Interventions in Bhola

- Arranged Training for religious leaders (Imam, Kaji)
- Arranged Training for Ansar VDP leaders.
- Support Conditional Cash Transfer(CCT) for disable children.
- Display film show by the step of District Information officer in different schools.
- Established adolescent corner in Upazilla health complex.
- Supply IFE tablet for adolescent and pregnant women.

Support needed from GoB; stakeholders

- Orient Kazi (marriage registrar) -- to verify signature of UP Chairman/Secretary in Birth Registration Certificate
- Ensure more attention and support (hardware & software) of food commodity, Nutrition,
 Education (stipend for high risk students)
- Non-partisan responsives local government for high risk areas to Child Marriage.
- Make space of participation of ECM field staff (UC/WP) in the meetings of Union Parishad Social Protection Committee

Support from District Administrations

- To arrange for increasing no. of mobile court to prevent child marriage in remote area/union
- Instructions to UP Chairmen for birth registration properly, within 0-45 days and also for updating birth registration database.
- Inclusion of WDC members/representatives at monthly coordination meeting at DC office.
