Education team organizes training for Host Teachers

COAST Education Program has organized a 5 days training to enhance the skills of Host Community teachers. The training was conducted at the COAST Regional Office in Cox's Bazar.

This training started on 12th September and ended till the evening of 16th September. The five days training was attended by 13 local teachers and a program organizer.

Mohammad Jabedul Islam, the technical officer of the Coast Education Team, facilitated the training and the other two technical officers Masum Billa and Azhar Riaz conducted the training session.

Jahangir Alam, Regional Team Leader of COAST trust, was present on the second day of the training. He emphasized on enhancing the skills of teachers. Jahangir Alam said- 'A teacher has to be in education all the time. If teachers don't learn regularly, Students will not get proper and updated knowledge.

Conducts CCDRR training to reduce risk of LC

The COAST Education Project has organized training for teachers in disaster preparedness. The first part of this two-part training was held at the UROC office. The first episode was held in 2 days due to COVID-19. On the first day, 41 teachers and 3 POs of Camps 1, 2, 6, 11 and 19 participated. On the second day, 34 Teachers of camp 14, 15 & 16 participated in the training. The day-long training started at 10 am and ended at 5 pm.

Rezaul Karim, Team leader of COAST UROC, inaugurated the 2 days training in UROC. In his inauguration speech, he said that Cox's Bazar is a disaster prone area. Not knowing what to do in the event of a disaster can cause a lot of damage. So you have to use the knowledge of training in your working Learning Centre.

Project Manager Jasim Uddin and Technical Officer Jabedul Islam were the trainers in the first session of the training. In the second session, participants were divided into 6 groups. They made a plan for the LC. The training ended with a speech by Program manager Jasim Uddin Mollah.

The second episode was held at the camp. 80 Burmese teachers took part in it. Technical officers and program officers provided training to them. In the second part, the Burmese teachers describe their experience in various disasters after the arrival of the camp and how they mitigate these disasters.
