As a part of humanitarian assistance, COAST Trust has been implementing the "Education Program" for Rohingya Children with the financial and technical support of UNICEF. The COAST Trust has 80 Learning Centres in 8 Camps. 6593 Learners are taking basic and informal quality education with entertaining environment.

Monthly Teachers meeting conducts

Monthly Host Teachers meeting has been conducted in 4 days in COAST Trust UROC office at Ukhiya in Cox's Bazar. Everyday 20 teachers attended the meeting. The meeting was held on 13 July and ended on 16 July 2020.

The teachers appeared before 9 am at the meeting venue. The temperature has been checked by digital matching and sprayed germicide. In addition, washed hands and sat down maintaining social distance.

Caregiver Led education Review, Experience of student data collection during lockdown and instruction, Recent circular-COVID-19 code of conduct, use of mask, etc, LC cleaning, safety & security, Damage, repairing work, Teacher Activity during LC close and open, Regular study teacher guideline, How to use Whatsapp & Facebook group were the agenda of the meeting.

Jabedul Islam, Technical officer, discussed Caregiver led education and gave them necessary instruction. He instructed to teachers follow up regularly. On the other hand, It is a big challenge to ensure LC's safety and security in this lockdown period. Masum Billah, Technical Officer, provided instruction to ensure the safety and security of LC.

Monthly BLI teachers meetings were conducted at 8 Camp on 19 July. All BLI attended the meeting on there working camp. TO and PO conducted the training.



One year of tree plantation: Still alive more than 3 hundred trees

The education program conducted a survey of tree plantation after one year of planting. We found the survey that more than 3 hundred trees are still alive.



COAST education program planted more than one thousand seedlings in one year ago under the self-funding of staff. Various species of seedlings were planted. After one year around 70% of seedlings are demolished due to Heavy rain, Children and community people's unconsciousness. Different species of trees were planted besides Cucoko LC in Camp-14. We found only a Nim tree touched the roof of LC.









LC Repair-2: Learning Centre ready for students

Renovation work of 19 learning centers damaged due to cyclone Amman has been completed. The Learning Center have been prepared to provide lessons for Rohingya students.

Super cyclone struck in different parts of Bangladesh and West Bengal, India. The Cyclone damaged homes and facilities in Rohingya camps. This also affected 53 Learning Centre among the 80 LCs led by Coast Trust. First-round We repaired 34 LCs and second-round repaired 19 LCs in July month. There was roof, shields and porches damaged.

In addition, LC cleaning is regular work. In this reporting month, we have completed our LC cleaning. Under the supervision of PE held the cleaning work. PO and BLI help to do this smoothly.

It's a great challenge for the education team to maintain LC's safety and security in this lockdown time. We are maintaining this by regular communication with LCMC, Maji and parents.

Abdullah, the father of Shafique, a student who lives near to the Tuberose Learning Center in Camp-2, said, "The porch of our LC was destroyed due to Ampan. After the reforms, it is now as good as before. My child will be able to go to LC again if the situation of Covid-19 gets better.

Shehera reads everyday

Shehera, Six years old child, is living in Camp-2 with parents and 3 other siblings. Shehera's 2 siblings have been admitted to the Learning centre led by different Organizations. Shehera is a student of Rose LC leaded by COAST Trust.

LC has been closed due to COVID-19 since March 2020. Fatema Begum (32) mother of Shehera is aware of the education of her son. She teaches regularly twice a day.

Shehera said that- My mother teaches us every day. If he can't do it my elder brother Faruk teaches us twice in a day.

Fatema Begum said that- My three children go to the Learning Centre. Because of Coronavirus, they don't go to LC. Although LC is closed I teach them regularly. If I can't teach them my elder son teaches them.

Rose LC is very near to Shehera's house. She comes to watch LC regularly. Shehera doesn't know when their LC be opened again. She wants to go to LC like before.

She said that- many days I can't go to my Learning center due to Coronavirus. I didn't feel better at home. I want to go to my LC regularly and want to play with my friends.

Around 7000 Learners are studying in COAST leaded LC. Education can't wait. Under the COAST UNICEF programme caregivers are leading children's education in Rohingya Camp.
