COAST Education Program has completed 'Ability based Accelerated Learning training' in Cox's Bazar. The second phase of the training was organized at COAST Cox's Bazar regional office.

Mahfujur Rahman, Camp in Charge of camp-1, inaugurated the training. In his inauguration speech, he said that—Teaching is a respectable profession for every person. A teacher needs to keep update all time. Digital platform makes easier to learn anything anytime. You have to know the history of Rohingya and Myanmar otherwise you can't teach the Rohingya child properly. He added that—Everybody should love his/her profession. If you can love your job the job will be enjoyable for you.

This training was started on 12th October and ended on the evening of 16th October. 13 Host teachers and a Program Organizer of camp 15 was attended on the training . Coast's Cox's Bazar regional team leader Jahangir Alaom and head of humanitarian response Shahinul Islam Shohag also attended the training as a Trainer.

## Conducts CCDRR training to reduce risk of LC

The COAST Education Project has organized training for stakeholders in disaster preparedness. 240 Stakeholders, Such as Majhi, LCMC and Imam, participated in the training. The training was held in 8 Rohingya camps. The training started at 10 am and ended at 2 pm.

Technical Officer (TO) and Programme Organizer (PO) conducted the CCDRR training for stakeholders in camp. Three Participants from each LC were invited to attend the training.

Due to COVID-19, the training was held in 2 days for each camp. To create awareness about disaster among the Rohingya community, To enhance the ability of disaster risk reduction and a short description of the possible disaster was discussed in the training.

Trainer emphasized knowing what's on communities' mind. The Rohingya community express their opinion spontaneously on the meeting .

Sayed Alam, head Majhi of camp 14 at Block B/2, said that—We came to Bangladesh to live it's one kind of disaster of our life. We want to go back to our country. As long as we can't go we have to preserve our wealth provided by the Bangladesh government and NGO. One of them Learning Centre. We must save it from disaster for your generation.

## Mothers participations increase due to regular session.

Naturally, Rohingya mother's don't get out of the house. All-time they stay at home it's Rohingya's culture. It starts from the beginning of the juvenile (Mathai kapod Deya) age and continues until she died.

Rohingya's mothers' participation has been increasing day by day by regular sessions and home visits. Recently we conducted one training and two community engagement activity in Rohingya Camp.

In this reporting month, we conducted parenting education in the camp. A total of 730 Parents, 10 from each Learning centre, participated in the Session including around 438 Mothers. Average 60 per cent of mothers participated in Parenting education. Besides, The participation of females in other training and meeting is eye-catching.

As well as, They don't talk in the session. This is impressive news for us they are participating in a different session. They are expressing their opining and demand.
