Youth leadership and conflict management training

Youth participation should be ensured in developing leadership and conflict

On 26th and 27th of May 2021 two daylong training on leadership, conflict management, social cohesion and human rights with the youths of Balukhali Prathasha and Lombabil Kira Parishad held at Kutupalong High school and Hnila sub office, Teknaf. 50 influential club members participated in the training. The training was organized & facilitated by COAST Foundation and supported by UNHCR. Tanjir Uddin Roni, Advocacy and Communication officer & Riaz Hossain M&E Officer took their sessions on Basic of leadership and team management, conflict management. They discussed about what is leadership, function of leader, how to become a good leader, what is management, how to become a good manger and conflict resolution strategies through PPT. Facilitators added that youth are the power of a society, Youth should have leadership and courage enough to stand against all negativity of the society. After the training participants share their opinions. Most of them said, the most important session of training was conflict management strategies. They said" Now we know how to deal with a problem or conflict, now it will not be big issue to solve or mitigate a conflict. In the group work session facilitators narrate some conflict issue and they the participants came up and present wonderful conflict resolution strategies.

With the support of UNHCR, COAST Foundation is working for improving social cohesion and peaceful co-existence among Rohingya and Host Community people of Ukhiya and Teknaf Upazila under Cox's Bazar district. COAST Foundation ISC Project frequently organize ward level session with women of host community at different wards in Ukhiya and Teknaf upazilla. So far 12 sessions have been organized to raise awareness about social cohesion and to sensitized on Human Rights. Women of different ages and races have been participated in these sessions. Local women leaders were used to present in the session. They share their views on human rights and social harmony in the Rohingya context. Mrs. Morjina Bagam Member Rajapalong UP standing committee said, "women are our main power in building a prosperous society. Women are now strong enough to take responsibility". Civil society, journalist, teachers, public representatives, religious leaders are the pioneer of any society. But most of the time women do not get such space to know or get involved with social work in Ukhiya and Teknaf. To this sense COAST in coordination UNHCR has come up to aware marginal women about Human rights and social cohesion.

Youth skill development training Total of 120 youths from Rohingya and host will get skill development training in five trades.

Eighty host youths and forty Rohingya youths are going to get skill development training in different trade. With the consultation with UNHCR five training trade have been selected primarily. These are-Driving, Mobile repairing, **Basic** computer skill, Plumbing, General Electronics for host community youths and Masonry, general electronics and solar panel repairing training for Rohingya youths.
