Background	COAST has been facilitating strengthen, accountable and self-esteem NGO-CSO 3 rd sector in Bangladesh since the inception of the organization. Followed this commitment COAST undertook many initiatives for organizing NGOs-CSO, prompting global commitments in this regards and advocating for adopting for behavioral changes in the sector; the UN agencies, Donor community, INGOs and National and Local level NGOs and CSOs.
	Especially during 2013 to 2106 COAST organizes Bangladesh NGOs and CSOs towards WHS process through accumulating their opinions and published charter of expectation and seven actionable points towards world leaders and stakeholders in WHS. The WHS has ended during May 2016 in Istanbul but carry forward the new narrative of policy and to promote the policy implementation the Grand Bargain process has initiated by around 51 Lead donor countries, UN (United Nations) agencies and INGOs (International Non-Government Organization). In the final outcome report from the UN Secretary General after the WHS, https://worldhumanitariansummit.org/sites/default/files/media/A-71-353%20-%20SG%20Report%20on%20the%20Outcome%20of%20the%20WHS.pdf , please see the section C, where it has been given importance on supremacy of local and national organization. On the basis of this, all most all the INGOs have signed Charter4change (www.charter4change.org ,) with a commitment to respect greater and sovereign role of local and national organization and channeling more direct fund to them aiming to promote a sustainable and accountable NGOs growth. We are also using the term CSO (civil society organization) in respect of NGO in this regard.
	Taking these changing perspective with emergence of new narrative in civil society / non-government organization 's partnership, and in taking the opportunity of the World Humanitarian Day, Bangladeshi local / national NGOs who have been actively participated in those process do like to place their expectations in public and discuss with all related stakeholders especially with donors, INGOs and UN agencies.
	COAST had done above activities sometimes from small/ partial funding from potential INGOs and most of the time from organization's own fund. Recently COAST entered a collaborative project with Oxfam for promoting localization and building self-esteem and accountable NGO_CSO. Oxfam have come with a portion of the fund projected for the project. The project will mobilize Local and Nationa Bangladeshi NGOs and CSOs toward developing their self-commitment to be accountable and charter of expectations from UN, Donor and INGOs in the light of WHS outcome and development effectiveness; Grand Bargain, Localization, Charterer for change. This workshop is the first action of the project. We have primarily inviting divisional 4 NGOs and CSOs per division who are potential, have mind set up to activism and have minimum ability to share cost of the program if need.
	Within above international and national perspectives, Bangladeshi CSOs need to realize as follows; (i) Need to play as effective third sector role must be embodied not only in service delivery (whether humanitarian or development) but also with advocacy issues making state accountable at the end. (ii) Need to promote human right, social justice, equity and all above the principles of
