Electrical Toolbox Distribution

COAST Foundation, in collaboration with UNHCR, provided skills development training in driving, basic computer learning and electrical house wiring to a total of 93 youths in Rajapalang, Huaikong and Hnila Unions in 2021. COAST is working to create employment opportunities for these trainees. In continuation of this, the COAST Foundation is working to ensure the participation of trained youth in various IGA activities by providing training materials.

After the arrival of Rohingyas in 2017, the local people were affected in various ways. The livelihoods of the local people in particular have been severely affected. To mitigate this negative impact and empower local youth, the COAST Foundation, in collaboration with UNHCR, provides 2 months of technical training on electrical house wiring to a total of 40 local youth. The equipment was distributed to involve the trained youth in the IGA activities of the local youths. At present, 6 of the trained youths are already involved in the IGA activities.
