COAST Foundation is implementing a multi-dimensional project entitled "Enhancing Self Resilience and Protective Environment for Rohingya and Host Community Children, Adolescents and Youth in Cox's Bazar district (ESRPE) in 8 camps and 3 unions in Ukhia and Teknaf Upazila. The duration of the project is from 01st January 2021 to 28th February 2022. During the project children, adolescents and youth will be benefitted from child protection services and educational opportunities such as case management, psychosocial support & recreational activities, life skill-based education, literacy & numeracy, vocational educational training including social hub facilities through the multi-purpose centers and adolescents clubs. This will strengthen self-resilience and ensure protective environment among the children, adolescents, and youth.

Psychosocial support, Computer training, sanitary pad making, Tailoring etc. Display centers have been set up at many points to promote the product displaying and market engagement. Products made by graduate adolescents to be concerned with the public which in turn will help the graduate adolescents to get opportunity to be involved in local market. Seven graduate adolescents have successfully get involved in the Women Led Community Center of Gano Unnayan Kendro. Through this engagement they will be able to earn BDT 7200-7500 per month. This will enable them to support their families financially and contribute to family welfare.

Case Workers have been collaborating for a variety of services by identifying and assessing high-risk children Under the Case Management Services of the Child Protection Project. A total of 610 cases have been registered by the project caseworkers and almost all have been resolved. Mohammad Enayet Ullah, one of the attentive adolescents of the Multipurpose Center. His mother died at an early age and his father remarried. Till then his stepmother tortured him in many ways. As a result, he lost his power of the eyes. He couldn't see and read anything. Caseworker Nipa, referred him to Orbit Hospital and doctors provided him glasses and medicine. After following the instruction, now he can read & see everything. He shared that, now he can see everything and very grateful to COAST & UNICEF.
