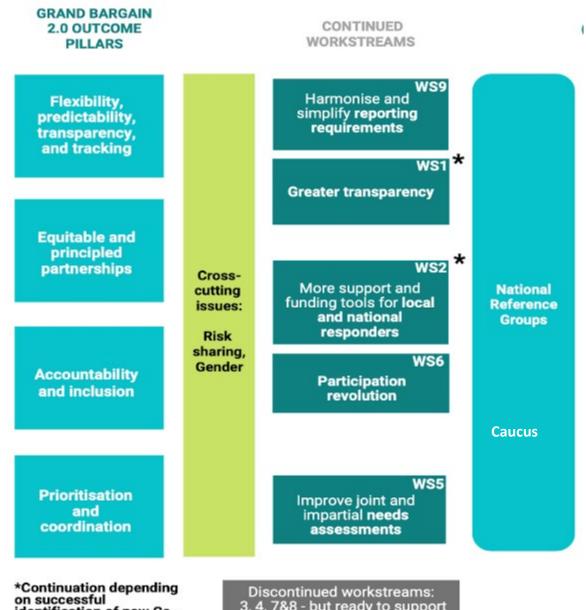
- 1. Greater transparency

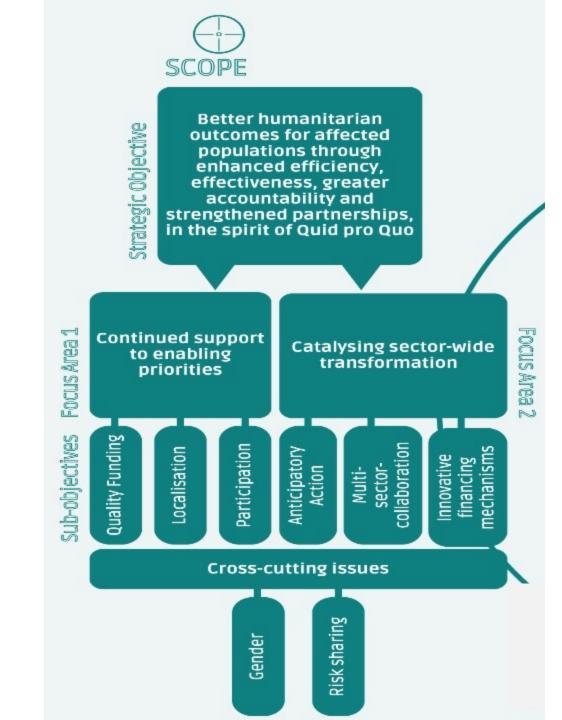

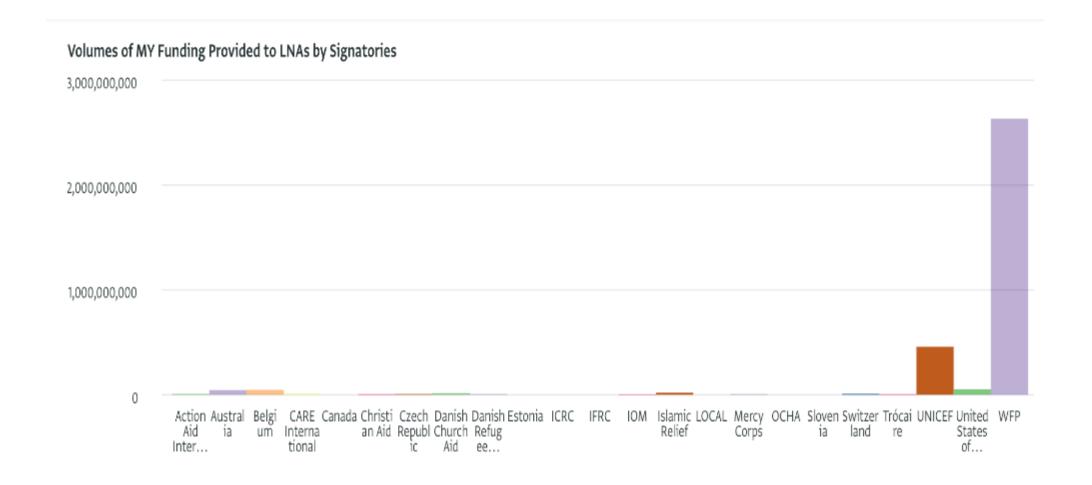

Continued support to localisation, participation of affected communities, and quality funding

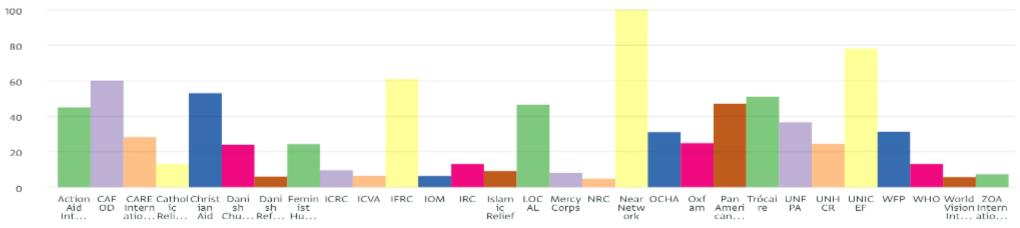

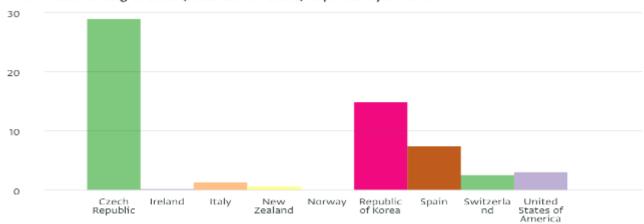


- Volumes of MY Funding Provided to all Partners by INGOs, UN Agencies, RCRC and Donors are still very low.
- This support is applied to Flexible Funding too.

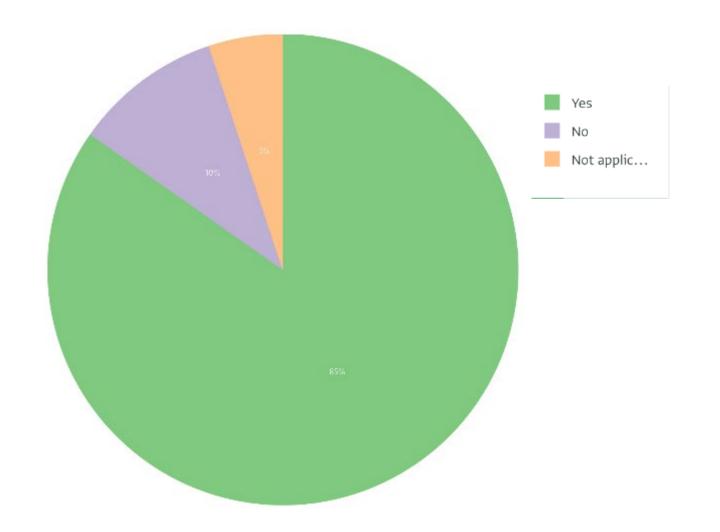




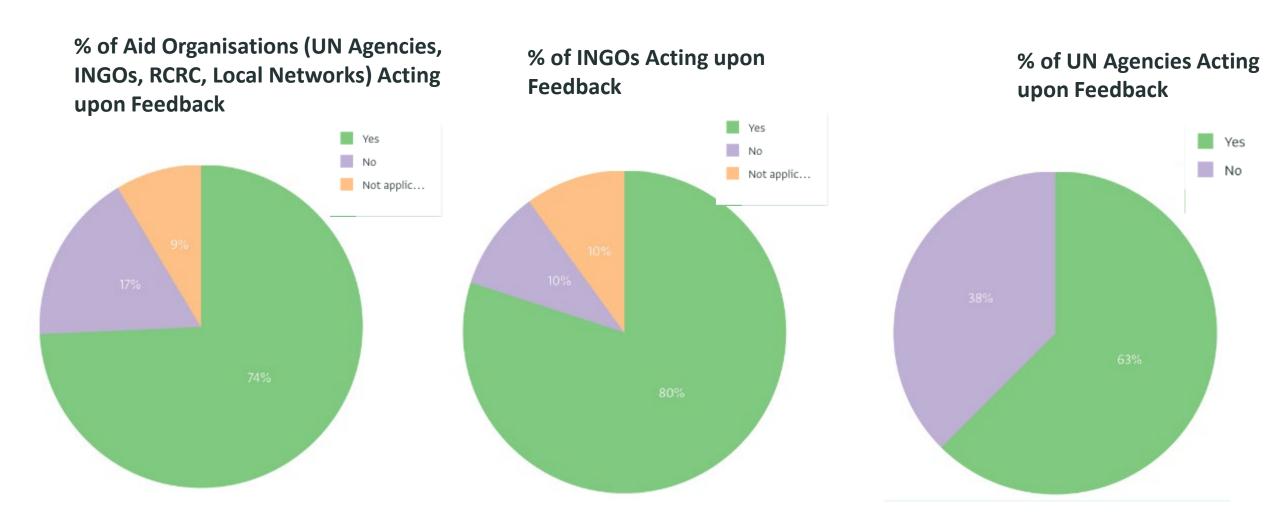
#### % of Direct Funding to LNAs (State & Non-State) Reported by Donors



% of Funding both "Direct" and "as Directly as Possible" Provided to LNAs (State & Non-State) by UN Agencies, RCRC, INGOs, Local/National NGOs/Networks and donors are not at the expected levels.



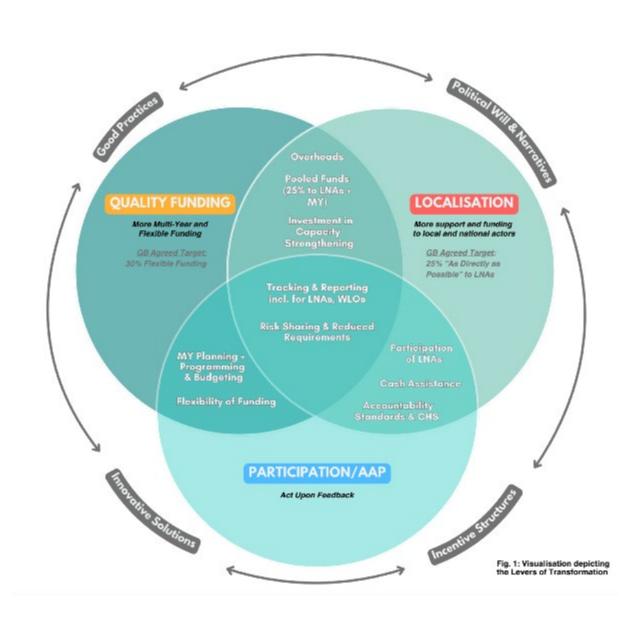
- Only 85 % of Signatories that cover their LNAs Overheads.
- Only 2 years left for GB 3.0 implementation.



- Only 74 % UN Agencies, INGOs, RCRC, Local Networks) Acting upon Feedback.
- Only 80 % INGOs Acting upon Feedback.
- Only 63% % of UN Agencies Acting upon Feedback.

#### 2024 GB Annual Meeting: What was on the Implementation Agenda

- Measurable objectives and indicators for progress over the next 2 years.
  - Provide greater support for the leadership, delivery and capacity of local responders.
- Donors increase contributions to pooled funds that provide at least 25% of funding to LNAs.
- AOs improve internal systems to track and report on funding including for LNAs and WLOs.
- Donors increase investments in capacity strengthening of LNAs.
- Donors and AOs replicate and scale initiatives to reduce compliance burden.



#### What can we do to accelerate GB 3.0 at the Local I Level

- Need a common understanding of localisation definition.
- Who is local? Need to be agreed.
- In many cases, Local Actors are absent in the country's Localisation Process.
- Redefine capacity, L/NAs capacity must be valued.
- Develop Institutional capacity, not top-down training.
- Avoid sub-contract relationships.
- Aid transparency.

- Good discussion at HQ levels, but less implementation at country levels.
- Based on the GB 3.0 Action Agenda, country L/NA needs a roadmap from the Intermediaries for providing-
  - **✓ Quality Funding**
  - ✓ More support for Localisation
  - ✓ Participation/ AAP.
- CoP for simplified and harmonized reporting, DD passporting, Risk sharing & Anticipatory Action.
- Establish NRG
