Title of the session	<b>Facilitating Rohingya Refugee &amp; Citizenship Rights</b>
Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Renewed global attention to keep alive the Rohingya crisis, keeping their plight on the international agenda through the event at RHPW, media coverage and regular advocacy campaigns <b>in respect of humanitarian assistance and durable solution.</b></li> <li>b. <b>A stronger, collective voice</b> from Rohingya activists, civil society, and diaspora networks across Asia-Pacific pushing for justice, rights, including safe and voluntary repatriation.</li> <li>c. <b>Positively encourage Bangladesh government to recognize refugee rights</b> or at least to provide access to education, income generating activities, travel pass, bank accounts and prefabricated shelters to the Rohingya refugees.</li> <li>d. Advocate for the recognition of <b>Rohingya citizenship and rights in Myanmar.</b></li> </ul>
Short description	<p>The Rohingya community suffered persecution in Myanmar, including the deprivation of citizenship rights. They have to take refuge mostly in South and East Asia, and especially in Bangladesh. The biggest exodus happened during 2017, now there are around 1.2 million sheltered in Coxsbazar, Bangladesh. Coxsbazar is the second-highest poverty district and is on the verge of climate catastrophes. Last 30th <a href="#">September 2025</a> UN organized a conference on Rohingya issues, almost all the member states supported the cause except India, China, and Russia, which expressed some reservations. Rohingya refugees and diaspora activists expressed determination to continue the struggle. COAST Foundation has campaigned since 2017 and also did the same nature of campaign adjacent to the UN conference. Rohingya activists and other human rights activists from the Asia-Pacific will discuss how they can best support the Rohingya crisis at this RHPW 2025 session.</p>
